

Below is a chart of notable states who have taken steps to prepare for a pandemic flu from ANCOR's state share and Office of Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response.

Arkansas, Florida, Ohio	April 25-27, 2007 HHS coordinated with three State Health Department EOC's in a Pan Flu Exercise.
Arkansas, Florida, Ohio, Michigan, Georgia	August 14-16 CDC sponsored a Pan Flu Surge Exercise where representatives from five states served in an Exercise Control Group to replicate activities in their states and others not represented.
Connecticut	Connecticut has required all providers to complete an extensive Continuity of Operations Plan. The plan included a 'go bag' for each person and a tiered relocation plan that can be implemented even with a loss of communication.
Iowa	Iowa participated in Operation Wild Canary, a full scale exercise in partnership with HHS. It tested antiviral distribution from the federal stockpile down to local treatment facility.
North Carolina	Vaccines will be a crucial prevention method once a pandemic begins and North Carolina has created vaccine priority groups.
Maine	Highlighted by ASPR for forming pandemic workgroups on all levels and for creating an intergovernmental Pan Flu Planning Committee (Dept of Agriculture, Emergency Services, etc.).
Wisconsin	Cited by ASPR for improved planning for treatment centers, resources and personnel and have a point of contact for each treatment facility.
Atlanta, Los Angeles	Praised by ASPR for their work with Business Executives for National Security to engage local corporations in preparedness. LA will be the first private-sector representative ever included in a security exercise at the vital Port of Los Angeles (gateway for 40% of U.S. trade).
