



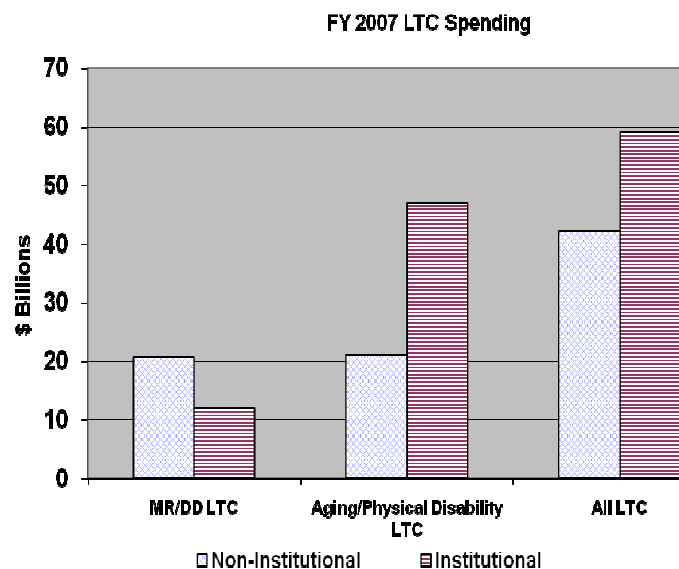
DEMOGRAPHICS

MR/DD TRENDS – UNITED STATES

- 598,016 people received services from either HCBS waiver or ICFs/MR, **+ 3.5%** from FY06.
- 278,328 people lived in congregate settings; 157,765 (56.7%) in settings of 6 or fewer.
- 115,569 people lived in homes they owned or leased, **a 10.7% increase** from FY06.
- 36,972 people lived in family/foster care, **an increase of 4.7%** from FY06.
- 88,349 on waiting lists (41 states) for residential services, **an increase of 4.5%** from FY06.

Vermont:

- Medicaid enrollees 161,300 residents (26% of population) in FY05.
- Disabled enrollees 20,100 in FY05.
- Nursing home care accounted for 71.5% of long term care spending in FY07.
- Home/personal care accounted for 28.5% of long term care spending in FY07.
- Fiscal Effort (\$ for MR/DD services/\$1000 of aggregate statewide income) **increased 6%** from 2004 to 2006
- 6 individuals supported in ICFs/MR, 0 state and 1 private serving 6.
- Waiting List: 0 on waiting list as of FY07.
