2022 National DSP of the Year Maria Swift

Penn-Mar Human Services Westminster, MD



Whether it's tying up a muffler on a company van or creating visual aids to improve supports, Maria's innovation knows no bounds! She constantly strives to better understand the people she supports by creating aids, doing task analysis and picking up on gestures. By utilizing these to tailor supports, individuals feel a sense of ownership over their actions and can ultimately be proud of their progress.

Consider how Maria supports individuals with dementia in creating daily schedules. She has taken the initiative to capture and print photos of the individuals completing common tasks so they can easily understand their options and choose between activities. Maria is always asking herself, "What do they need to complete this task without me?" and then putting the answer into action.

Maria excels at supporting and advocating alongside individuals while supporting families in a manner that is respectful, informative and doesn't cross boundaries. This was tested when she began working with a family who has guardianship of a 22-year-old man who wanted to find a girlfriend.

The man's family was initially against him finding a girlfriend, and they were concerned that encouraging this desire could lead to a range of problems. Maria shared that it was important to work with the desire rather than wave it away, as the results could be more dangerous. Instead, she took the time to explain to the family why supporting him to pursue his goals was so critical to living a more fulfilling life. At the same time, she recognized their concerns and worked to put their minds at ease.

Maria's approach centers the understanding of an individual's needs and a focus on when and why anxiety or discomfort is being triggered. She then implements techniques to de-escalate these experiences through redirection rather than avoidance, so that the people she supports can continue participating in their communities in a way that feels safe.

Chrysalis Cedar City, UT


Cheyenne loves coming up with creative solutions to help the people she supports overcome challenges. This is demonstrated by the ways she helps people manage a range of food allergies. Cheyenne did extensive research to develop a cookbook for an individual with allergies to dairy, corn, rice, yeast, baking powder and baking soda.

Now that the cookbook is complete, the person Cheyenne supports can use it to choose meals from the book of options. Then, they work together to prepare healthy, delicious meals. From identifying what groceries are needed to pre-packaging meals for the week, Cheyenne supports the management of otherwise dangerous allergies in creative and fun ways—all while staying within the calorie limit prescribed by the doctor!



2022 Special Category Award for Leadership Brett Breeze

In the past year, Brett has assumed a number of leadership roles to support frontline positions. When integrated care was introduced at Brett's agency, it was evident that many of the people he supported could benefit from an increased focus on behavioral health goals. Brett took the initiative to learn these techniques to improve not only the supports he delivers, but also those delivered by his colleagues.

From there, Brett designed an entire training curriculum to support the initiative. He shared strategies and applications and demonstrated the successes of those supported under this new guidance. He provided encouragement for his peers to dig deeper into their service delivery approach. It's no wonder Brett's team recently celebrated one of the people they support for achieving their goal of community employment and a renewed sense of belonging.


2022 Arizona DSP of the Year

BrightSpring Health Services Phoenix, AZ



Francisco offers valuable insight and coaching when new DSPs join the staff, and he makes himself available to all his colleagues to discuss ideas for activities that can benefit the people he supports.

But Francisco's communication prowess doesn't end there—he translates for the people he supports during classes and activities, as well as for families during support meetings. Francisco has helped the people he supports connect with their families and with one another by recognizing each person's unique communication style—whether they speak English, Spanish or American Sign Language. Across the board, Francisco's support is key to connection and community!





2022 Colorado DSP of the Year John "Jonny" Nelson

When COVID-19 turned the world upside down, Jonny knew he had to get creative to keep things as normal as possible. He read books over FaceTime to help someone he supports continue honing their reading abilities and build their spelling and vocabulary skills.

When the pandemic made it unsafe to go out in public, Jonny brought his guitar to the home of another person he supports for a jam session. The aspiring musician was thrilled to learn how to play their favorite song, "Smoke on the Water" by Deep Purple, on the guitar! Jonny also instituted "porch time" and played socially distanced Tic-Tac-Toe on a dry erase board. Jonny also took the people he supports on short walks around the neighborhood so they could not only get some exercise, but also the chance to talk and be listened to—both of which helped put minds at ease during a very difficult time.

2022 Connecticut DSP of the Year

Sandra Strilkauskas

Aspire Living & Learning Waterbury, CT

When someone Sandy supports refused physical therapy to learn to walk again after breaking their hip, Sandy contacted the PT team and arranged for therapy to occur during her work hours so she could encourage them and celebrate their progress. After four months, the person learned to walk again and was able to return home.

When COVID-19 first hit, a group of people Sandy supports couldn't go on their routine coffee trips. Sandy saw this as an opportunity to teach people how to make their own iced coffee—they even went to Dunkin' Donuts to get the plastic cups they really liked! When one of the social butterflies Sandy supports was really missing chatting with the servers they used to see, Sandy worked with clinicians to devise a plan to enable them to safely resume daily drive-thru trips so they could continue having those important interactions in the community.



2022 Delaware DSP of the Year Ruby Mills

After being placed in the care of the state a long time ago, a man Ruby now supports didn't have contact with any of his family. He doesn't communicate verbally, but often uses gestures to express his desires. On holidays, Ruby could see that it was difficult for the man to lack any family connections. In turn, she researched years of historical documents in an effort to locate any family members. This led Ruby to eventually come across the man's younger sister!

Ruby reached out and was able to reconnect the man she supports with his sister, who agreed to come for a visit. When she arrived, the man Ruby supports was ecstatic. Not only did this offer the opportunity to build a relationship with his sister, but also her daughter—the man's niece. Thanks to Ruby, the man now feels a sense of family and belonging.


2022 Florida DSP of the Year

Sherry Ellis

BrightSpring Health Services Port Richey, FL

In 2018, Sherry began working with someone with a visual impairment, which often caused them to experience intense levels of fear—and, in turn, intense behavioral challenges—whenever they were alone. Sherry championed person-centered supports by making it her mission to develop a relationship and implement a communication-heavy approach with choice-based techniques to redirect fears.

Sherry learned the various activities that prompted positive reactions and, eventually, even bursts of laughter. Sherry and other staff began integrating her approach with their active treatment, which led to a number of breakthroughs, including gradually navigating to the restroom without any assistance and shedding the fear of being alone. What used to be intense outbreaks soon became calm verbal requests. Thanks to Sherry, they finally gained the confidence to truly shine!



2022 Georgia DSP of the Year Temeake Lowe





At the beginning of the pandemic, special protocols were put in place that limited visitation in the homes RHA operates. Though necessary, these limitations strained family relationships. In response, Temeake worked within her agency's guidelines to set up outdoor visitation areas to ensure the people she supports could visit with their families.

One of the people Temeake supports is very close with their family and can grow anxious if they go stretches without seeing them. Temeake's efforts enabled them to have the support needed to gather with family safely, which in turn mitigated intense behaviors that increased in frequency when day programs were closed. Thanks to Temeake's innovative approach and understanding of the needs of the person she supports, they minimized their own feelings of anxiety, isolation and sadness during an incredibly trying time.


2022 Idaho DSP of the Year

BrightSpring Health Services Dalton Gardens, ID


Jon takes the time to get to know the people he supports, and then uses his understanding of their strengths to support them to accomplish their goals. He discovered that two individuals he supports learn and focus better through visual stimulation. He used this discovery to support one person to learn to use pictures to communicate their shopping list and the person to use index cards to recite their address.

Jon also works with individuals on positive affirmations to redirect challenging behaviors, and has discovered music therapy as an effective technique. Music helps the people he supports feel calm and at peace, which fosters better communication and has empowered people to be more independent and more well-rounded by helping them pursue and achieve their goals.



2022 Illinois DSP of the Year Veronica Lea





Veronica pays close attention to the people she supports and does not hesitate to report changes in behavior or medical condition. Her attention to detail and diligence in reporting has helped prevent serious medical issues. One individual she supports developed a slight but frequent cough, causing Veronica to notify a nurse and seek medical care. It was determined that there was a mass on the person's lung that required immediate medical treatment.

Veronica noticed another person she supports was acting differently in the morning and again arranged medical care—this time, it was determined that the person had a minor stroke. Thanks to Veronica's attentive, tailored supports, people are living fuller, healthier and more independent lives.


2022 Indiana DSP of the Year

Susia supported someone who developed a decubitus ulcer that would not heal. She requested specific instructions from the doctor and every day, for several months, followed those instructions. In the beginning, the person rarely spoke to anyone, but Susia would always talk to them during her shift, eventually establishing a trusting relationship. Susia continued to take the time to build the relationship by reminding the person to provide feedback during treatment. Eventually they were speaking to Susia consistently, which helped them feel at ease and ready to pursue treatment for the ulcer. Though it wasn't easy, and treatments were often uncomfortable, Susia guided them to fully heal.

It's no wonder why, when the person's mother learned that Susia was nominated to be the 2022 Indiana DSP of the Year, she responded, "I don't know of a soul that deserves this award more than Susia!"

Teresa works to fully understand the individual needs of the people she supports. She generates ideas and plans to benefit the people she supports and follows through on those plans to encourage people to be self-reliant and strive for their goals. 2022 Kansas DSP of the Year


Latoya Whitted-Witcher

Undeterred, Stephanie made arrangements on-the-spot to safely move the person up the stairs and into the pool to help fulfill their dream!


2022 Louisiana DSP of the Year



The Resource Center Sinclairville, NY




2022 Ohio DSP of the Year

2022 Oregon DSP of the Year


Miranda Baugh

Jennifer, Brittany's supervisor, shared that "It is difficult to fully understand Brittany's accomplishments without viewing them in the context of the tragedies she endured during the COVID-19 pandemic. She never ceased to support the individuals at our Endfield home even after the death of her husband in 2020 and the tragic murder of her 16-year-old son in 2021.

It's almost impossible to imagine how a person could bring so much joy into the lives of others while dealing with these profound personal losses. In some ways, her work to create a family for [the people supported] at Endfield gave Brittany an outlet to transform grief into a life-affirming gift for others."

2022 Rhode Island DSP of the Year

David Asiedu

Community Living of Rhode Island Narragansett, RI

David crafts his supports around the person-centered plans of the people he supports. If it's meaningful to them, it's meaningful to David. In one instance, David was able to uncover one man's childhood appreciation for firefighters and love of firetrucks.

The man's dream was to one day wear full firefighter gear and "toot the horn" on the firetruck. It wasn't an easy thing to pull off during a pandemic, but David knew he had to make it happen. He reached out to one of his firefighter friends and orchestrated the transformation of this dream into a reality! Together, David and his friend surprised the man with a visit to a local fire station where they had the opportunity to fulfill every aspect of the dream. They suited up in full firefighter gear and hopped inside the cab of the truck to toot the horn!





2022 South Carolina DSP of the Year Dawanda Brown

Dawanda makes sure that everyone she supports can achieve their fullest potential. When an individual who uses a wheelchair expressed a desire to work, Dawanda helped support their search for a job with the proper accommodations. Eventually, they were able to secure a position after Dawanda encouraged the employer to build a workstation to help them more easily accomplish the key functions of their job.

Dawanda's constant monitoring of progress toward people's goals ensures that they are continuing to challenge themselves while also thinking ahead to bigger, loftier goals.

2022 South Dakota DSP of the Year

Hau Quan

Aspire, Inc. Aberdeen, SD

Hau's deep experience as a DSP and her attentiveness to the people she supports allows her to notice any changes that may signal larger problems. One time, when someone she supports who communicates nonverbally began exhibiting discomfort, Hau jumped into action.

Hau and a colleague helped get the person to the ground, where Hau performed CPR while her colleague called 911. Hau continued to provide CPR until emergency responders arrived and took over. Thanks to Hau's urgent response and reaction in the critical moments before emergency responders could arrive, the individual's life was saved. Though it was a scary moment, Hau was unphased—as soon as the person was stabilized in the care of the paramedics, Hau calmly turned her attention toward calming the other people in the group who watched this intense situation unfold.



2022 Tennessee DSP of the Year Edward Copeland

Edward loves uncovering the desires for new experiences among the people he supports. His refusal to accept what others would see as limitations filters to the individuals he supports and helps them think of and achieve their goals. Once he determines what they would like to do and who they would like to spend time with, he does his very best to make it happen—just like the time he discovered one of the individuals had a love of horses.

With this discovery, Edward contacted local horse ranches to see if they would accommodate a visit. One ranch owner not only agreed, but was delighted! With Edward alongside, ranch staff took the people Edward supports on a tour of the barn and stalls, where they got to pet many of the horses on the property. It was an experience they'll never forget!

2022 Texas DSP of the Year

Isabel Diaz

BrightSpring Health Services Santa Rosa, TX

When an individual Isabel supports was diagnosed with cancer, she volunteered to provide transportation to and from treatments—a whopping 660 miles away. Over the span of a month and at the recommendation of the person's oncologist, Isabel took them on the five-hour road trip three times.

On one trip, the hotel accommodations they had made fell through, and the person Isabel supports couldn't track down the hotel employee who processed the reservation. Rather than panic or drive back, which would have required delaying the treatment, Isabel started calling around. She was able to identify a family friend in the area who agreed to let them stay the night so the person Isabel supports didn't miss such a crucial appointment!



2022 Utah DSP of the Year Collin Saltern

Collin is all about building relationships and having fun while doing it! A primary example is his famous annual Thanksgiving meals. Every year, Collin hosts his colleagues and the people he supports who don't have family with which to spend the holiday. He plans the entire event from menu to décor and works to make it a dedicated communal event that everyone can enjoy.

It has since turned into such a highly anticipated event that even staff who have moved onto other jobs return to visit former colleagues and the people they used to support. This event truly defines Collin's perspective and the approach he takes to individualizing supports. He's invested in making everyone feel connected, fulfilled and close, an approach that permeates throughout the organization as other DSPs follow his lead.

2022 Vermont DSP of the Year

Liza Bothfeld

Green Mountain Support Services Hyde Park, VT


During COVID-19 stay-at-home orders, Liza ensured that not only were the people she supports safe, but that they could remain connected even while apart. She set up virtual *Wheel of Fortune* games for the people she supports and ensured everyone was able to play. The game gave many people something to look forward to at a time where each day seemed to blend into the next. It also gave people the chance to see and spend time with familiar faces.

Liza understands and supports the rights of the people she supports to engage in intimate relationships. She helps them manage intimate relationships appropriately and encourages best practices when those relationships do not work out. Supporting people to express and pursue their sexual needs can be uncomfortable to some, but Liza understands that it's necessary for people to live whole lives.

This approach has allowed her to move toward supporting individuals in a deeper ways. She's instituted nutritional meal programs that help the people she supports live healthier lives, and she supports them in virtual meetings with a chef to re-design their individualized menus according to their unique nutritional needs and tastes.



2022 Washington DSP of the Year

Shannon Ramsey

Northwest Center Kids Burien, WA

Shannon was designing innovations for the people she supports long before COVID-19, but the pandemic only accelerated her creativity. She was an "early adopter" in terms of getting the people she supports online for check-ins before the pandemic, which made it simpler for her to segue into using Zoom for telemedicine visits and support plan meetings. Shannon also used digital games as tools to help people practice engaging online.

Shannon also used her creativity to put together job-related activities to keep people thinking about work, even as their workplaces were shut down. For example, she used word searches with terms related to their work as a method of coaching. She also set up remote coaching sessions and developed a presentation for her coworkers to learn her techniques and help her smart ideas reach more people.







Stephana enriches interaction with others by encouraging the people she supports to attend group activities and family gatherings. She has organized parties and loves getting people to participate in activities such as camping, bowling and exercising.

Stephana also pays attention to people's whole health. For example, one person she supports requires a low-fat, low-calorie diet, so Stephana took time to uncover their favorite recipes. She used this information to create personal recipe sheets that included calories to make it easier to track. She helps the person grocery shop based on the recipes they choose and she encourages them to exercise, including by helping find an exercise partner to make the process more enjoyable. Thanks to Stephana's supports, they're thriving in their nutritional and fitness goals, and the results are evident!

2022 Wisconsin DSP of the Year

Laura Nelson

Dungarvin Reedsburg, WI

One of the people Laura supports has a Fetal Alcohol Syndrome diagnosis. To determine the best methods of communication with this person, Laura found training materials on communication styles specific to their diagnosis. She then took it a step further to understand which proposed interventions were best so she could craft her supports around them.

Laura used the knowledge gained to implement direct and straightforward communication in the home, and encouraged others to do the same to ensure consistency. The change in communication style had a noticeable impact, as it helped alleviate behavioral challenges and provided a sense of comfort. The individual has stated that they feel this has helped to build trust with staff and allowed them to feel comfortable reaching out for support in times of crisis.
